I was reading Proverbs 31:10-31 (The Capable Wife) and these verses that Jesus said in Matthew 19:4-6 came to mind as well.

... at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female, for this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh {(echad) meaning one complex unity}. So they are no longer two, but one flesh (echad). Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate.
